Otsiquette Peter, an Oneida Chief, who signed the Treaty of 1788. He was well educated and had visited Lafayette in France, but returned to savage life. He was a member of the delegation of Chiefs to Philadelphia in 1792, where he died and was buried with military honors.

He was also called Peter Otzagut and Peter Jaquette. Elkanah Watson described him at the Treaty of 1788. Peter Otsiequette, perhaps the same Indian, witnessed the Onondaga Treaty of 1790.
