Albany December 29th, 1830

Record from Isaac Deunistou Agent of Indians Affairs for the State of New York our hundred and two dollars and twenty four cents in full of the annuity due to the first Christian Party of the Oneida Indian's on the 13 February last upon the sum of one thousand seven hundred and four dollars the value of two hundred acres of the land ceded by said dubious to the state by the treaty of the 13 February 1829 and the value of which said two hundred acres was to be reserved by the state and the interest on the same at six percent was to be paid to the said dubious annually for the support of a teacher at Green Bay; the authority from the principal were of the said party to receive the some by we being now recorded in the office of the secretary of state.
