### Boundaries of Lands at Green Bay

Boundaries of Lands at Green Bay, located for the accommodations and settlement of the New York Indians by Commissioners appointed by the President of the United States.

Beginning at the point, on the N.W. line of the session by the Menominees to the United States, by the Treaty of Little Butte des Morts, in ancient 1827, due west from the mouth of Duck Creek emptying into Green Bay; thence running east to the mouth of Duck Creek aforesaid. Thence S. Westerly so as to leave the most easterly improvements of the Oneida Settlement on said Duck Creek, to the N. West of such line, till it intersects the aforesaid N. West line of said session, by the Menominees, to the United States, thence South Westerly in said mentioned line to a point N. 40 degrees west from the mouth of Plumb Creek on the east side of Fox River, thence S. 40 degrees E to the ----- of S E Fox River. And opposite said Plumb creek; thence up and along Fox River, to the Butte des Morts, so called; thence N 45 degrees West far enough to make a triangular piece of Land, by drawing a short line from such point in this last mentioned course to the place of beginning, as shall contain within said boundaries two hundred and seventy five thousand acres, exclusive for all legal private land claims.

Also on the east side of Fox River, as follows (to wit), beginning at the foot of the rapids, of the Grand Kawkawne "running thence as, said Fox River to the little chute" and extending back from the river on this width two and a half miles, S 45° East far enough to contain six thousand acres of land, it being understood that if the government of the U. States shall pay the New York Indians, now living on this location for their improvements, then they are to move onto the opposite side of the river.

Also located specially for the Brothertown Indians as follows – Beginning on the east side of Fox River at a corner made by Thomas Dean near the foot of the Rapids called the Little Kawkawnee, thence up and along the Fox River to the mouth of Plumb creek, and extending back on this width, south 45 degrees east, far enough to make twenty thousand acres of Land.

It is further understood that an equal quantity of land, with that contained, in the foregoing description, and comprehended in the session of the Menominees at the Little Buttes des Morts, shall be taken from the lands on the east side of Fox River, between the grand Kawkawnee and the Winnebago Lake, between parallel lines running right angles from the south line of said session to Winnebago Lake.

Boundaries of Lands at Green Bay, located for  
the accommodation and settlement of the New York Indians  
by a commission appointed by the President of the United  
States

Beginning at a point, on the N. W. line of the section  
by the Minnonsiees to the United States, by the Treaty of  
Little Bottle des Morts, in August 1727, due west from the  
mouth of Duck Creek, emptying into Green Bay; thence  
running east to the mouth of Duck Creek aforesaid. Thence  
S. westerly so as to leave the most westerly improvement of  
the Oriskany Settlement on said Duck Creek, to the N. W. line  
of such line, till it intersects the aforesaid N. West line of  
said section by the Minnonsiees, to the United States, thence  
southwesterly in said last mentioned line to a point 24.40  
degrees West from the mouth of Plum Creek on the east side  
of Fox River; thence S. 40 degrees E. to the South of S. Fox river  
and opposite said Plum Creek; thence up said along Fox  
river, to the Little Bottle des Morts, so called; thence S. 45  
degrees West far enough to make a triangular piece of  
Land, by drawing a straight line from such point in this  
last mentioned course to the place of beginning, as shall  
contain within said boundaries two hundred and  
seventy five thousand acres, exclusive of all legal  
private land claims

Also on the east side of Fox river,  
as follows (to wit) Beginning at the foot of the rapids, of the  
"Gravel Run" running thence S. 45 degrees E.

Improvements, when they are to move on to the opposite side  
of the river

Also located specially for the Bootherdown Mines  
as follows — Beginning on the east side of Fox River at  
a corner made by Thomas Dean near the foot of the rapids  
called the Little Kawkaumee, thence up and along the  
Fox River to the mouth of Plumbe creek, and extending  
back on this width, south 45 degrees east, far enough to make  
twenty thousand acres of land —

It is further understood  
that an equal quantity of land, with that contained in  
the foregoing description, and comprehended in the cession  
of the Winnebagoes at the Little Butte du mort, shall be  
taken from the lands on the east side of Fox River, between  
the general Kawkaumee and the Winnebago Lake — between  
parallel lines running at right angles from the  
line of said cession to Winnebago Lake —
