When Washington made the  
first-treaties he joined our  
hands with his to love each  
other and live with each other  
so every reservation is composed  
of different <sup>Indian</sup> tribes  
who have <sup>inter</sup>married with  
each other. and their descendents  
Now the Onondaga Res - is  
composed the same way  
and Onondaga & Onondagas  
have intermarried <sup>years</sup>  
and years ago and their  
children know no other  
home than here, but the  
chiefs are counselling every  
night to drive all such  
away from here, now where  
can they drive us, and  
they themselves are not  
full blooded onondagas.  
Please write to me what we  
shall do, and please write  
to them, telling them to stop  
this disturbance.
