Dear Sir,

About last June
Mr. Skinsdore missed a calf
which he had from in the baby
of letting me and my father
a week search for him in
the town of Onulico Board
who is living about 1 1/2 miles
from here. Mr. Board claimed
that police man John C. Stegman
was from permission to keep
the calf, as a stray and allowed
to give him up. Mr. Skinsdore

consent to this, as John C. ^{Wheeler}
was prejudiced in the case and
had a bias, refused to have
Mr. Baird give him up. I

very much told Mr. Jennings
so but have heard nothing
since from Mr. Baird,
and I asked him to settle it

himself or pick up the man
to decide it.

In the mean time Mr. Baird
feeling he was to lose the
case had the objection
given to some white man
who came up and gained
the case paying for him
