to the Council, but the articles being short,
the H-Regis Indians are not represented.

If it is necessary to amend the bill,
I would recommend that the H-Regis Res-
olution be included with the same and
amendments thereto.

At a meeting of the council of the Six Nations of New York Indians on the Sussewanna reservation at their council house on the 30th day of January 1885 in the State of New York, the following resolution were adopted, viz: Resolved - This council of the Six Nations of New York Indians, Petition and Pray Congress of the United States, that Senate Bill No. 48 48th Congress / Session, be so amended that it may exempt the reservations of the Onondagas and Sussewanna Nations from the provisions of said Bill.

At a meeting duly held in council of
the Six Nations of New York Indians on the
Juncosora Reservation at their common
House in the State of New York, on
the 30th day of January 1883; the following
Preamble and Petition Prayed for were passed,
To the Senate and House of Representatives,
in the Congress of the United States of America
Assembled,

Whereas: Senate Bill No 48, 48th Congress
1st Session being introduced by Senator Cote,

"to provide for the allotment of lands in
severalty to Indians on the various reservations,
and to extend the protection of the laws of the
State and Territories over the Indians, and
for other purposes," now pending in Congress,

Resolved: That we, the undersigned Chiefs
and Head men of the said Six Nations of
New York Indians, Do hereby very Respectfully
and earnestly Petition and Pray your Honorable
bodies, to amend Section 9 of said Bill, so that
the provisions of said act shall not extend
to the reservations of the Onondago and
Juncosora Nations, in the State of New York, by
striking out the word, "Nation" between the words
"Seneca and" in the fourth line of said
Section, and insert instead, the following words,
viz "Onondago and Juncosora Nations" so as

"Sec. 79. That the provisions of this act shall not extend to the reservations of the Cherokee, Creek, Chickasaw, and Seneca, in the Indian Territory, nor to any of the reservations of the Seneca, Onondaga, and Susquehanna Nations of New York Indians in the State of New York." by so doing you will add one more cause of gratitude to the many, your Petitioners already feel towards your Honorable Assembly, and only wish the fulfillment of the existing treaties, so you we will ever Pray.
