Copy of letter to Mr. Riley in regards to Nickol Jordan

Dear Mr. Riley,

The Executive Committee would like you to write to Nickol Jordan, Routel, Oneida about redeemed land, where Lomis and Lucy Jordan had Live Use. They are now both deceased. At the present time Nickol Jordan lives on the place in a small frame house. His mother, Lucy Jordan, had been renting 26 acres to a white farmer for a unknown amount per season. Henry Visser is the farmer, Mr. Jordan has been informed that the rent money should be paid to the tribe, since both parents are deceased, however he still insists that Mr. Vissers should pay him for the use of the land. Thus far he has not made an application for this land assignment.
