My first impression of Kerron was that he was a dull, unappealing individual. I was distracted with his interesting facial expressions which seemed more forward on his mouth and mustache than his eyes.

Kerron did not know what he was being interviewed for. When I mentioned the university philosophy towards community outreach work and the VISTA project, he seemed to come alive.

Kerron described his experiences which gave him considerable knowledge of VISTA strengths and weaknesses. I was very impressed with his ability to formulate suggestions, and learning from his many varied experiences.

I was equally impressed with his divergent interests - English and Social Work. His view of education seemed very much akin to the philosophy at UWGB.

As the interview progressed, Kerron became much more articulate and personable to me.

He felt that his knowledge of education would be an invaluable resource in community work. He believes in interdisciplinary learning, and relevance in education. To him, paper writing is irrelevant in terms of the social contributions that the same time might accomplish in community action. However, he does not negate the importance of applied research and writing.

Kerron impressed me as a young man who enjoys living and sharing with others. He is aware of change and its impact on people and is in constant search of ways to improve communication among people.

In short, Kerron was not dull or uninteresting to me. I was impressed with him and found it hard to end my conversation with him.
