Aid Is Sought for Owners of 'Indian Lands'

A move to get Small Business Administration aid for the holders of land that has been claimed as tribal property by upstate New York Indians has been started by Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz.

Mr. Lefkowitz said yesterday that he had outlined to Governor Carey a procedure under which if at least five businesses have suffered hardship, the Governor could certify this to the S.B.A. and make the landholders eligible for assistance. The hardship could stem from difficulty in mortgaging or selling the land because of doubt as to its title.

The claims are by the St. Regis Mohawks, for about 14,000 acres near the St. Lawrence River, and by the Cayugas, for about 62,500 acres in Cayuga and Seneca Counties around the northern end of Lake Cayuga. The Mohawk claim includes Barnhart Island, on which the State Power Authority operates the St. Lawrence Power Project.

At issue is whether New York State had the power to purchase these lands from the tribes when it did so in order to provide cheap warmland for veterans of the Revolutionary War.

Tribes Cite Act of 1790

The tribes cite the Federal Non-Inter-course Act of 1790 requiring Federal approval for any state treaty with the Indians. Under New York State's interpretation, the purchase was legal under the act and had Federal sanction since some of the payments to the Indians were made through the Federal Govern-

The first regular meeting to attempt to negotiate the claims has been set for

Jan. 26 in Washington by Leo M. Krulitz, solicitor of the Interior Department.

Jeremiah Jochnowitz, the assistant state attorney general who has been handling Indian claims since 1960, said his office had also been working with banks and the Monroe Abstract and Title Company of Rochester to soften the effect of the Indian claims on the present owners of the properties. He said that S.B.A. aid had been sought by Massachusetts propertyholders facing similar claims.

Mr. Lefkowitz said he was sending letters about his S.B.A. move to members of Congress and state legislators whose constituencies might be affected, as well as to the State Power Authority.
