Authorizing Solomon Davis, in their stead, to receive all money for the Oneidas, for their expenses as delegates, being about to return to their homes.

Rec'd March 5th 1851

To: The Hon. Commissioner of Indian Affairs
Washington, D.C.
From: Daniel Bread, Jacob Cornelius, and Jacob L. Doxtator

We, the undersigned Chiefs and delegates of the Oneida Nation of Indians residing at Duck Creek, in Wisconsin being now about to leave the seat of Government of the United States for our homes, do hereby surrender to Solomon Davis all authority delegated to us by a certain power of Attorney, executed by the Chiefs and Head men of our Nation, and deposited in the office of the Commissioner of Indians Affairs. The said Solomon Davis, is fully authorized to receive all sums of money that may, by Congress, be appropriated for our Nation and also for our own expenses as Delegates; and to execute therefore to the proper Department, such voucher as may be required in full discharge of the same our said Attorney is also authorized to settle and arrange all our matters and expenses in the city of Washington. We hereby solemnly bind ourselves and our Nation to abide by his acts and doings in the premises, ratifying and confirming the same, as if we ourselves were present consenting and assisting.

Done by the delegation in Council, this 24th day of January 1851.

all authority delegated to us by a certain
Prover of Attorney, executed by the Chiefs and
Honor-men of our Nation, and authorized
in the Office of the Commissioner of Indian
Affairs. The said Prover of Attorney, is fully
authorized to receive all sums of money
that may, by Congress, be appropriated for
our Nation and also for our own expenses
as Delegates; and to execute thereon, to the
Hon. Hon. Davis, at Washington, D.C.

agrees, in our own view, is fully
authorized to receive all sums of money
that may, by Congress, be appropriated for
