

Power of Attorney form Daniel Bread to John T. Cocheram

January 24th 1851

Know all men by these present that I Daniel Bread, of the state of Wisconsin and one of the Chiefs and headmen of the Oneida Tribe of Indians, residing in that state, do hereby ordain, constitute and appoint John T. Cochrane of the city of Washington, my true and lawful attorney; for me, and in my name, to present to the officer of Indian Affairs, or any other of the officer or Department of the general government, and to demand payment of, a certain claim which I have against the said government, for my expenses as a delegate to the city of Washington, in the later part of the year 1831 and the early part of the year 1832, on the part and in behalf of the said Oneida Tribe of Indian in relation to important business connected with and growing out of the Treaty between the United States and the Menominee Indians of February 1831; and upon the receipt of the amount of said claim, or any part thereof, my said attorney is hereby authorized and empowered to make and deliver the necessary release or discharge for the same; and I hereby ratify and confirm whatsoever my said attorney shall lawfully do in the premises. growing out of the treaty between the United States and
the Government of Great Britain, 1831, and upon
the receipt of the amount of said claim, or any
part thereof, my said Attorney is hereby au-
thorized and empowered to make and deliver
the necessary release or discharge for the same;
